Attendance and Discipline

No outsider is allowed to enter the college without proper permission. Students have to be in proper uniform during the whole academic session. The Uniform of the college is white Kameez (Below the knees), white Salwar and white Dupatta (plain) and Black Sweater in winter. For married students, the uniform is Pink Kameez (Plain), Pink Salwar (Plain) and Pink Dupatta (Plain).

If a student remains absent from the college without prior permission of the Principal for more than ten consecutive days, her name shall be struck off from the college rolls. Unlawful assembly of students in the college is prohibited. Writing on the walls or pasting posters is a grave offence.

Rules of Discipline

- 1. Students are responsible for their conduct to the Principal and are prohibited from doing anything either inside or outside the college that will amount to a breach of discipline or interference in the discipline and normal working of the college. A student shall be liable to disciplinary action for violation of any of the rules of discipline. Disciplinary action may involve warning and/or suspension from classes, from the examination, from use of the College Library or even from the College.
- 2. Students shall conduct themselves in a polite manner, both towards the members of the staff (teaching and administrative) and towards their fellow students. Insubordination, unbecoming language or ungentlemanly conduct including teasing etc., shall be severely dealt with.
- 3. Mobile Phones are strictly prohibited in the college campus for the students.

- 4. A student desirous of withdrawing her name from the college rolls should submit an application countersigned by the parents/guardian of the student. The withdrawal certificate shall be issued only after the student clear all the college dues. Such students shall not be re-admitted during the same academic session.
- 5. Any student, who indulges in any indiscipline in the college, shall not be eligible for any prize, certificate, college honour, award for scholarship from the institution. This shall apply to all the students including NCC cadets, NSS volunteers and players as well.

Identity Card

Every student, on being admitted shall be issued an identity card which she has to carry all the time and shall produce on demand by any member of the college staff anywhere in the college premises. Loss of the identity card should be reported immediately to the College authorities.

A new identity card is not ordinarily issued. However, after proper verification, a duplicate I—card can be issued against a payment of Rs. 100/-. Identity card must be returned at the end of each session failing which an amount of Rs. 50/- shall be charged.

Record of Attendance

A student needs to attend a minimum of 75% lectures delivered during the academic session, both in theory as well as in practicals to be eligible to appear in the University examination.

Internal Assessment

Theory: There shall be one internal assessment test in the every subject as per the schedule given in the institutional academic calendar.

Certificates

An outgoing student may obtain the following certificate from the college:

Scholarship/Financial Aid

Post Matric National Scholarship is given to the meritorious and handicapped students and similar other scholarships sponsored by Central/State Government are awarded to the deserving students. Scholarships for scheduled castes/tribes and for lower income groups, and Merit-cum-Poverty Scholarships are awarded by the State

Govt. The grant and continuance of a scholarship is subject to the following conditions:—

• Production of Income certificate, enabling the candidate to apply for the scholarship.

Scholarship Shall be Drawn Only for The Period Given Below.

- ✓ Academic session for which the candidate has sought admission in the college.
- ✓ Meritorious but economically poor students are given financial aid to meet part of their needs on the basis of an interview conducted by a Selection Committee of the college, as per the rules given above.

Co-curricular & Extra Mural Activities

In order to provide opportunities to the students for self-development the following activities are organized in the College on regular basis:—

- (c) Essay/Paper writing and Quiz Competitions.
- (d) Cultural Programmes.

In order to strengthen and support the institutional activities in the college, various cells have been constituted. As per interest of the students, new projects are planned and implemented by the college administration through these cells.

NCC

NCC, which stands for National Cadet Corps, was formed in India in 1948 as a voluntary organisation which recruits cadets from high schools, colleges and universities all over India. The cadets are given basic military training in small arms and parades. In living up to its motto, 'Unity and Discipline', NCC strives to be and is one of the most significant cohesive forces of the nation, bringing together the youth hailing from different parts of the country and moulding them into responsible and courageous citizens of the nation.

One company of NCC with strength of 50 cadets exists in the college. Enrolment of students to NCC is done at the time of admission. All girls who are physically fit are ordinarily enrolled as cadets. Regular parades (twice a week) are held under the supervision of the P.T. Staff of the Army and NCC officer. Complete uniform is issued to each NCC cadet. They have to be in their uniform in all the parade sessions. Annual training camps are held, in which only selected NCC cadets of GDCW Kathua who cadets can participate. NCC cadets are selected and participate in local RD parade. Every year cadets go to different parts of the country to participate in National Integration Camps, Mountaineering courses, Trekking Adventures, Rock Climbing and other such activities. The expenses for all such camps are borne by the NCC

organization.

The cadets are trained in handling fire arms The NCC cadets can qualify for 'B' and 'C' certificates after completing the required eligibility conditions and successfully passing the tests held by the NCC Directorate. NCC organization helps students to prepare themselves for the service of the nation in peace and wartimes.



NSS of this College takes pride in its vast pool of immensely zealous volunteers who show a profound amount of initiative and eagerness in undertaking all kinds of social services, as well as identify and resonate with the cause and aim of NSS. It is an important activity of the college is to train the students in the process of nation building. One unit of NSS volunteers is functioning in the College. Our NSS volunteers participates in the social work, health, environment activities and literacy campaigns at the town, district, state and national level. These volunteers have got recognition for their work and dedication at all. Students enrolled as NSS Volunteers are required to put in at least 120 hours of Social Work and attend one camp of 7 days duration to become eligible to receive a certificate, which carry an addition weightage at the time of placement as well as admission to higher classes. Annual camps are held to infuse among the volunteers, the spirit of selfless service and dedication to the cause of social reconstruction. The motto of NSS is "NOT ME BUT YOU". Our NSS volunteers have shown keen interest to live upto this motto.

Women Development Cell

Women's Development Cell (WDC) of the college plays an active role in making the students aware of the problems faced by women and suggest ways and methods for their development in society. WDC sensitizes the college community on issues pertaining to women's rights, gender parity and empowerment It attempts to sensitize and raise awareness of gender discrimination, women's rights, and empowerment concerns among the student and teaching communities. This cell deals with the problems exclusively faced by the female students. Members of the cell meet twice a week to find solutions to their problems. Experts from the Medical Department, Social Welfare Department and Women organizations are invited to deliver lectures on any issue of importance and problems faced by women students in the society.

Career Counseling Guidance & Placement Cell

The placement Cell is an integral part of GDC for Women Kathua. It functions to ensure the best placements for the students graduating from this College. In GDC for Women Kathua recruiters on account of its excellent performance sustained over a long

period of time and its strong brand image. To remain competitive in today's world, being adept in one area will not suffice. One has to be familiar with other domains too. Spearheaded by able professionals with guidance from the Principal and Faculty members, Placement Cell works round the year and closely coordinates with recruiting teams from leading corporate houses to make sure that every student gets suitable openings once they finish their courses. Placement Cell has a perfect understanding of how the corporate world works and this helps in organizing events and programs that provide avenues for the students to get exposed to the real world of work. At present, there is a great demand for knowledgeable, talented, and devoted people in the exposition. It provides assistance to students and the ability to think out of the box as it conducts Webinars, Seminars, Workshops, Personality Development programs, Guest Lecturers, etc. regular affairs and the students get ample opportunities to closely interact with professionals from different industries.

Eco Club

Eco club is a platform on which we got the knowledge about environment. The meaning of an eco club in a group who works to contribute to improving environmental conditions. They offer programs and activities to encourage others to reduce pollution, plant trees, and more. Eco club is a voluntary group of GDCW Kathua students called "ECO-ANGELS" which promotes students in learning and improving their environment. A Eco-club is a means by which students and youth can organize themselves to learn more and this issue, and also take action to improve their immediate environment. Eco club will take up activities and programmes through Seminars, Paintings, Debates, Symposia, Cleanliness Drives etc.. The main objective of Eco Club is to mobilize the students to undertake activities that help saving the environment for present and future generations of mankind. These Club co-ordinates with Government programmes under Mission LiFE and organizations to evolve strategies in creating healthy environment for all.

Road Safety Club

In order to create awareness among college students on road safety and to educate road users about the traffic rules, regulations and other road safety measures, a Road Safety Club is formulated in the college with a vision 'to reduce accidents and save lives'. Time to time various activities are being conducted in the form of :- Seminar scooty rally, Traffic awareness rally, Poster, Quiz & Slogan Competitions, lectures from Traffic and Motor Vehicles Departments etc. to develop skills among the students for taking appropriate action in various traffic situations & assist Govt. in implementing Road Safety Programmes.

Anti Ragging Cell



"Ragging" means the doing of any act which causes or is likely to cause any physical, psychological or physiological harm or apprehension or shame or embarrassment to a student and includes- (a) teasing or abusing or playing practical joke on, or causing hurt to any student. or(b) asking any student to do any act, or perform anything, which he/she would not, in the ordinary course, be willing to do or perform.

Prohibition of Ragging:

- (a) Ragging within an educational institutions is strictly prohibited.
- (b) No person shall participate in, abet or propagate, ragging in any educational institution.

Penalty for Ragging:

- (a) Expulsion from the educational institution, if found guilty on enquiry by the college against a complaint lodged by any other student.
- (b) Imprisonment of either description upto two years or fine upto five thousand rupees or both.

Drug-De Addiction / Anti-Tobacco and Psychological Counseling Cell (Manodarpan)

The college has been declared as a **Tobacco and Drug Free Zone**. This cell conducts various activities throughout the year to spread awareness about the iils of drug and tobacoo abuse inside and outside the college. Students are free to seek psychological counselling. All the information of the students seeking is psychological counselling kept confidential.

CASH : Committee Against Sexual Harassment

Cash Committee is in place in the college as per the UGC guidelines. Students of the college can report promptly about sexual harassment, sexual misconduct, and sexual assault to the sexual harassment committee members of the college. Persons found to be in violation of this policy shall be subject to disciplinary action as per the Supreme Court rulings.

Grievance Redressal Cell

To make the system transparent, accountable and accessible to all, the grievance constituted in the college. Complaints of the Teachers/Administrative Staff/Parents are received through a Complaint Box placed near the main notice board of the college. The box is opened by the Convener and Members of the cell once a week. All the complaints received get due redressal by the Principal/HOD of the concerned department, Librarian/Administrative Appropriate action is taken under rules to resolve the problems brought in the notice of the authorities by the aggrieved students/persons.

Science Club

The main purpose of the club is to inculcate scientific attitude among the students by organising various scientific activities like Seminars, Symposia, debates, quiz contests, etc.

Red Ribbon Club

The Red Ribbon Club is established with the aim for generating awareness among the students regarding HIV AIDS. The Club organises activities like Seminars, Symposia, Debates, Rallies, Skits, Poster Making Competitions, etc., on the various aspects of HIV AIDS.

Institution's Innovation Council

The Ministry of Education (MoE) through MoE's Innovation Cell (MIC) launched the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) program in collaboration with AICTE for Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) to systematically foster the culture of innovation and start-up ecosystem in education institutions. The primary mandate of MIC is to encourage, inspire and nurture young students by supporting them to work with new ideas and transform them into prototypes. Primarily, IICs' role is to engage large number of faculty, students and staff in various innovation and entrepreneurship related activities such as ideation, Problem solving, Proof of Concept development, Design Thinking, IPR, project handling and management at Pre-incubation/Incubation stage, etc., so that innovation and entrepreneurship ecosystem gets established and stabilized in HEIs.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION & SPORTS

The college has splendid play grounds for Cricket, Football, Hockey, Tennis, Volleyball, Handball, Kho-kho and Kabaddi, with sufficient facilities to organize sports activities. Sports Development Committee of the College encourages students to take part in games. Our students have represented the college at the State and National level and have brought laurels to this institution. The students are selected for field activity once the admission process is completed. They are encouraged to take part in

games of their own interest and sent for coaching to the coaching centres. Special arrangements have been made for indoor games in which the members of the staff and students can participate.

TOUR AND PICNICS

Educational and Subject tours, are organized from time to time by the college. Students are taken on subject tours arranged by the concerned departments. National educational tour is arranged during winter vacations for the students. Picnics in an academic year are held. Venues are decided by the mutual consent of the teachers and student's executive body jointly.

DEPARTMENT OF STUDENT WELFARE

Department of Student's Welfare acts as kind of liaison between the students and the College management. The Dean and Associate Dean of this department work for the welfare of the student community by organizing various activities that enrich their academic, literary, cultural and social life. This department in the beginning of each session, forms a Students Executive Body by electing representatives which works for the development of the institution in coordination with the Dean Student's Welfare.

STUDENT EXECUTIVE BODY

The college management through Department of Student's Welfare elects class representative from every section through an election process. Students' Executive Body is formed out of the students' selected as class representatives, which assist the college management in its functioning. It participate in policy making for students welfare. This body also helps in maintaining college discipline and guides the students to follow campus rules and regulations.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

The college library provides library facilities to its bonafide students. The college library is well furnished, and has a spacious reading room which promises a cool, calm and serene atmosphere for reading. It is stocked with dailies, magazines, journals and

periodicals. A special text book section has been created in the library to help the poor and deserving students to borrow test books, whenever required. Students can borrow only two books at a time and retain with them for a maximum period of 15 days.

LIBRARY RULES

- > Students can borrow books from the college library only on the production of their Identity cards.
- ➤ The borrowers shall be charged for cost of the book or they will have to replace them with a new copy in case the book is found damaged or lost.
- ➤ A fine of Rs. 1/- for each day shall be charged on each book in case the borrower fails to return the book/books on the due date.
- ➤ If a student loses her identity card, she must report its loss to the Chief Librarian at once and apply for a duplicate identity card after paying the requisite fee.
- ➤ Reference books cannot be issued to the students. These can, however be consulted by the students in the library. Students are not allowed to carry their personal books or belongings inside the collegelibrary.

COLLEGE CANTEEN

The college canteen runs by a contractor. The canteen caters to the needs of the students and provide eatables at reasonable rates.

COLLEGE BUS

The college has a bus for providing transport facility to our dear students. The College Bus Service is more secure for women students to reach college well in time in the hazardous atmosphere of local traffic. The nominal fee shall be charged for availing the Bus facility.

ADMISSION PROCESS (NEP2020)

INTRODUCTION

NEP2020, or the National Education Policy 2020, is a comprehensive policy introduced by the Government of India to transform the education system in the country. It aims to bring about significant changes in various aspects of education, from school to higher education.

Salient Features of NEP2020

- Multidisciplinary Approach: NEP2020 promotes a multidisciplinary approach to education, encouraging students to choose subjects across different disciplines and bridging the gap between arts, sciences, and humanities.
- **Reduction in Content Overload**: NEP2020 emphasizes reducing the content overload in the curriculum to focus on core concepts and critical thinking rather than rote memorization.
- **Skill Development and Vocational Education**: NEP2020 places significant importance on skill development and vocational education, aiming to provide students with practical skills and promote entrepreneurship.
- Assessment Reforms: NEP2020 advocates for a shift in assessment methods, aiming to move away from high-stakes examinations and focus on a more comprehensive and holistic assessment of student understanding and skills.
- Inclusion and Equity: NEP2020 emphasizes inclusion and equity in education, aiming to address gender and social disparities, provide equal opportunities for marginalized communities, and promote inclusive education for students with disabilities.
- **Research and Innovation**: NEP2020 recognizes the importance of research and innovation in education, encouraging the establishment of research centers and promoting a culture of research among students and teachers.
- Internationalization: NEP2020 recognizes the significance of internationalization in education. It encourages collaborations and exchange programs between Indian and foreign institutions, promoting global exposure and cross-cultural learning.

IMPLEMENTATION

NEP2020 is being gradually implemented across educational institutions in India, including University of Jammu. All the proposed changes may take time to fully integrate, but the policy aims to create a more inclusive, flexible, and relevant education system.

The undergraduate programme shall extend over four academic years (eight semesters). The students can exit with a:

- 1. **Certificate** after the completion of one academic year (two semesters);
- 2. **Diploma** after the study of two academic years (four semesters) and
- 3. **Bachelor degree** after the completion of three academic years (six semesters).

4. A candidate who successfully completes a three-year bachelor's degree with minimum CGPA of 7.5 and wishes to pursue the fourth year of the undergraduate programme shall be allowed to continue the programme to obtain the bachelor's degree with honours/research.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO FOUR YEARS UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES (FYUGP)

Admission to Four years undergraduate programmes (FYUGP) shall be on the basis of merit and availability of seats in a particular "Major Subject". For the selection of the major subject, preference shall be given to the candidates who have studied the concerned subject at higher secondary part-ll level.

PAYMENT OF ADMISSION FEE

The student seeking admission to the four years under graduate programmes (FYUGP) as per NEP 2O20 are required to submit the prescribed application form along with requisite fee for the First and second semester courses at the time of seeking admission to 1st semester.

Credit plan of the Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP) under National Education Policy (NEP-2020)

- 1. Major Course
 - Each student will study for
 - a) 62 Credits in Major for Three Year Graduation
 - b) 94 Credits in Major for Four Year Graduation (Honours)
 - c) 82 Credits in Major for Four Year Graduation (Honours) with Research

Major Course can be chosen from any subject from the following five disciplines

- Natural Science
- II. Social Science and Behavioural Science
- III. Arts and Humanities
- 2. Minor Course*

Each student will study

- a) 24 credits of Minor course for Three Year Graduation from 1ST to 6Th semester (4 Credits in each Semester)
- 32 Credits of Minor in same subject for Four Year Graduation (Honours) with Research

SUBJECTS OFFERING:

A candidate shall have to opt the following subjects in Ist Semester prescribed as per course framework (Annexure-I&II) for four years under graduate programmes (FYUGP) under National Education Policy NEP 2020.
